What is College Preparation?

College Prep offers a wide variety of accredited Alberta high school courses that will enable you to pursue further education in post-secondary programs or in the workplace.

What are my career opportunities?

Most of post-secondary institutions require specific high school courses be completed before admission to their programs. Course assignment will be based on your learning plan to meet career goals. College Prep qualifies you for programs at post secondary institutions, offers courses for credits towards a high school diploma and increases job opportunities.

What do I need to get into the program?

An interview with an academic advisor will be required to create your training plan; please bring your high school transcript (if applicable); an assessment test (CAAT Test C) and written composition may also be requested.

How long is the program and how is it delivered?

The duration of the program depends on how many courses you require for your training plan. Portage College offers three semesters: fall, winter, and spring (course availability in spring semester is limited). You have the option to study full-time, part-time or even online, giving you flexibility to reach your goals.

Will any of my courses transfer to other institutions?

College Prep courses are transferable to other programs at Portage College as well as to other colleges and universities.
