OPPORTUNITIES FOR HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS

Northeastern Alberta high schools and Portage College offer camps, free college credit courses and dual-credit trades programs, allowing younger students to get a preview of possible career options and post-secondary programs. High school students can choose the program that best matches their interest levels and schedules.

- Camps provide a one or two-day hands-on lab experience with college or university instructors from programs such as Natural Resources Technology and University Transfer. These labs range from field experience to DNA fingerprinting analyses.
- Students can also take one free university course per semester, as long as they meet certain course prerequisites or co-requisites. Students earn university credits and gain confidence and experience with post-secondary learning while still attending high school.
- 3. Dual-credit trades programs allow students to earn high school credits and college credits at the same time, while also getting a head start in the trade.

OPEN STUDIES

Not sure which program is the best for you? Portage College gives students the opportunity to experience more than one program at a time with Open Studies. This option is a unique way for students to explore potential career paths in various fields.

Students who have a general interest in a program or who don't meet the entrance requirements may enrol in individual courses rather than the complete program.

Admission requirements vary, so students interested in this option must meet with a Student Advisor prior to enrolling.

COMMUNITY ADULT LEARNING PROGRAM

The Community Adult Learning Program (CALP) at Portage College allows adults to learn meaningful skills, using delivery methods and scheduling to meet each learner's needs. CALP is available in Bonnyville, St. Paul, Frog Lake First Nation, Cold Lake First Nation, Whitefish/Goodfish Lake First Nation #128, Kehewin Cree Nation and Elk Point. All services and supplies are free of charge and funded by the Government of Alberta Advanced Education.

CALP offers personalized training in adult literacy, numeracy, English language, basic digital skills, job search and career development, academic preparation and much more. It can also connect learners to community supports and services for career counselling/employment, childcare, transportation, government programs and services, citizenship and immigration services, assistance with forms, or help with identifying other learning needs or services.

We are proud to operate CALPs in several communities in our region, even in the face of COVID-19. During this difficult time, the CALPs have done a tremendous job of staying connected with learners by adapting the program for the comfort and safety of learners. Staff continue to reach out and provide support over the phone or via email.



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AWARDS, SCHOLARSHIPS AND BURSARIES

The Portage College Awards Program has many awards, scholarships and bursaries available for enrolled students or those who have graduated from a program. The Awards Program not only recognizes student achievement, but also assists students in financial need. The program has continued to grow year after year. In the 2019-2020 academic year, over \$280,000 was awarded to 214 Portage College students.

In addition to awards distributed by Portage College, there are many external awards and scholarships available to students.



FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

Aboriginal Student Funding

The most common sources of funding are Band, Settlement and Regional Council. These are some of the first places for First Nations, Métis and Inuit students to look. Some funding opportunities can be accessed through government initiatives and non-profit organizations as well.

Alberta Student Aid

Alberta Student Aid offers student loans, grants, scholarships, and awards to help cover your costs while you're in school. It is recommended that you apply for funding at least two months prior to the start of your program or courses.

Alberta Supports (formerly Alberta Works)

Grant funding is available for Academic Upgrading students for specific courses required for entrance to a career program.

Apprenticeship and Industry Training

Registered Alberta apprentices and occupational trainees may be eligible for financial assistance when attending the technical training portion of their program.

Canada-Alberta Job Grant

Ask your employer to apply for this grant. Students may be eligible to receive up to 100% of the training costs to a maximum of \$15,000.

Government of Canada Student Financial Assistance

The Canada Student Loans Program provides financial assistance in the form of loans and grants to post-secondary students who demonstrate financial need.

Veterans' Education and Training Benefit

This new benefit will provide funding to help support for college, university or technical education to Canadian Armed Forces Regular Force and Reserve Force Veterans with at least six years of military service.





STUDENT ACCOMMODATION

Living on campus is more than just a convenient place to stay. Whether it's your first time away from home or you're a returning student, you will find that living on campus provides a safe environment that promotes academic success and provides plenty of social, recreational and educational learning opportunities. Our residence team coordinates student housing and works to ensure that your college experience is safe, supportive and fun.

You must be formally accepted into a Portage College program before your housing application will be processed. You may begin the application process before you are formally accepted. Once you are accepted, you will receive a letter of confirmation from Student Housing.

Boyle

With 40 single-person rooms, our Boyle facility is maintained to the highest possible standard to accommodate students in a camp-style living environment. All rooms are equipped with satellite television and a small fridge.

Lac La Biche

We offer accommodation for students and families at our Lac La Biche campus. Our on-campus Residence Hall, attached to the main campus building, offers students self-contained rooms designed for two students to share.

Each room includes two beds and two desks, a kitchenette with a two-burner stove top and fridge, table and chairs, and a full bathroom. Common areas in residence include microwaves and laundry.

Townhouses are also available and a short walk to the main building. The fully furnished units are shared by four students, each with their own bedroom. There are two bathrooms, a living room, a dining room and a full kitchen. Each townhouse is equipped with a washer and dryer.

A total of 66 units of two-, three- and four-bedroom townhouse accommodations are available.

St. Paul

Our modern, two-bedroom dorms at the St. Paul campus can house single students or small families and include a full-size kitchen and bathroom. Laundry is available on site.

STUDENTS' ASSOCIATION OF PORTAGE COLLEGE

The Students' Association of Portage College (SAPC) provides an inclusive environment which empowers students to achieve their educational goals.
