

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



For many people, General Educational Development (GED) is a way to obtain a High School Equivalency Diploma recognized by Alberta Education. Many employers will accept a High School Equivalency Diploma in place of a high school diploma, and some college programs accept it in place of a prerequisite.

GED CANDIDATES MUST:

- Be 18 years or older
- Have no high school diploma
- Be out of school for at least 10 months in a row

Primary Care Paramedics (PCPs) are integral members of emergency medical services. They are trained to save lives and to provide medical and trauma care in health services and industrial settings. We have four paramedicine labs, four nursing labs, five high-fidelity manikins, and one ambulance. Training includes clinical placement, putting you on the front line of a real-life medical environment.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

INDIGENOUS STUDENT FUNDING

The most common sources of funding are Band, Settlement and Regional Council. These are some of the first places for First Nations, Métis and Inuit students to look. Some funding opportunities can be accessed through government initiatives and non-profit organizations as well.

ALBERTA STUDENT AID

Alberta Student Aid offers student loans, grants, scholarships, and awards to help cover your costs while you're in school. It is recommended that you apply for funding at least two months prior to the start of your program or courses.

Grant funding is available for Academic Upgrading students for specific courses required for entrance to a career program.

APPRENTICESHIP AND **INDUSTRY TRAINING**

Registered Alberta apprentices and occupational trainees may be eligible for financial assistance when attending the technical training portion of their program.

CANADA-ALBERTA JOB GRANT

Ask your employer to apply for this grant. Students may be eligible to receive up to 100% of the training costs to a maximum of \$15,000.

GOVERNMENT OF CANADA STUDENT FINANCIAL **ASSISTANCE**

The Canada Student Loans Program provides financial assistance in the form of loans and grants to post-secondary students who demonstrate financial need.




