PRE-ATEP PATHWAY

Portage College and the University of Alberta have partnered to offer the Aboriginal Teacher Education Program (ATEP), available to students across northern Alberta. This partnership allows students to achieve a Bachelor of Education degree without leaving their home community.

The ATEP curriculum has a strong focus on Aboriginal histories, perspectives and culture, giving teachers a better understanding of young Aboriginal learners, their backgrounds and how this knowledge can benefit students in every classroom.

Following the requirements of an Elementary Education degree, the program ensures teachers meet the Alberta Education Teaching Quality Standard in their future classrooms. The benefits of taking ATEP at Portage College include small class sizes and built-in supports for students.

The third and fourth years of the Aboriginal Teacher Education Program will be offered at Portage College beginning Fall 2022.
