STUDENT ACCOMMODATION



St. Paul Hall offers self-contained rooms designed for two students to share. It is very convenient as it is walking distance from the College. Each room includes two beds, two desks, a kitchenette with stove and fridge, a table with chairs, and a full bathroom.

What to Bring: Students should bring bedding, towels, dishes, cookware, an alarm clock and personal items.

FAMILY HOUSING

On-campus family housing is available for full time students who have lived 75 km from the town of St. Paul for more than three years immediately prior to date of application, as verified in residence history. There is no kilometer restriction for single students.

Proof of childcare arrangements must be provided before acceptance into housing.

What to Bring: Families should bring bedding, towels, dishes, cookware, an alarm clock and personal items. They may also wish to bring televisions, microwaves, toys etc. Family students are asked not to bring furniture items. All units are fully furnished, and there is no storage available.

CAMPUS SECURITY

Campus Security staff are available on a regular basis.

LAUNDRY

A convenient on-campus laundromat is available.

PARKING

On-campus parking is available at no cost.

RENTAL PAYMENT



Full term students staying in Student Housing for more than 12 weeks may pay their housing account on a monthly basis, one month in advance. Short term students staying in Housing for less than 12 weeks will normally be required to pay their full housing account upon check-in, or at their program registration. Alternative payment arrangements may be considered in exceptional circumstances, such as sponsorship or funding criteria.

Rent is charged from the day you move in until the day you return your keys (on a pro-rated basis). Monthly rent is normally paid in advance.

The security deposit is required on or prior to your check-in. Student will receive a refund cheque, together with security deposit and a letter explaining amounts returned/retained.

Refunds are automatically prepared based on checkout information.
